GPOC New Member Outing—Clear Creek

It was a great turnout on Sunday March 25 for the first New Member Outing of the 2018 season. We had great weather too! About 20 people, including at least half as new members. It was great sunny weather until about 2:30pm when the clouds rolled in. We experienced a 3-4" drop in Clear Creek water level at around Ipm. That forced many of us to relocate or reposition. Many folks had sluices and we spread out all over the area to the West (upstream) of Broadway. Some ventured up around the bend, past the large dead tree stump and roots.

Generally water level was lowmid 40's cubic feet per second. The drop in water level after lunch happend quickly - in less than 15 mins. Perhaps the last bit of melting snow was gone or a water control dam upstream was active. Or as some of us joked, Coors started bottling and needed the water!
